What it is:

- An innovative learning format under Erasmus+
- Combines online learning with a short period of physical mobility

Casimir Pulaski Radom University – Key Facts

- **Type:** Public university in Radom, Poland, established in 1950.
- **Students:** ~5,500 total (both full-time and part-time).
- **Faculties:** 8 faculties covering technical, economic, humanities, arts, and health sciences.
 - Examples include Mechanical Engineering, Transport & IT, Economics & Finance, Law & Administration, Arts, Philology & Pedagogy, and Health Sciences.
- **Academic Staff:** Around 370–600 staff including academic teachers.
- **International Students:** Part of the student body includes foreign students (several percent).
- **Programs:** Offers Bachelor's, Master's, and PhD studies across more than 30 study fields and many specializations.
- **Housing:** About 1,000 places available in 4 dormitories for students.
- **International Opportunities:** Active in Erasmus+ and other exchange programs



**Host Faculty: Faculty of Law and Administration,
University of Radom**

- Established in 2019
- Composed of 6 Departments
- Offers education in three programmes: Law, Administration, and Internal Security
- Supports 6 student clubs and organizations
- Initiator and organizer of the BIP, providing academic guidance and fostering international collaboration.
